Tips for Families

READ ALOUD

Choose a chapter book and take turns reading. A challenging activity can be made less challenging by breaking down a book into smaller segments.

Reading aloud can encourage and motivate readers!



SET A SCHEDULE

Set aside time each day to read!

20 minutes a day will equal over 2 hours a week.

Morning or night – pick a time that works best for the reader!

SHARE & SUMMARIZE

Ask your reader to summarize what they are reading.

- What are the main ideas?
- Who are the characters in the story?
- What do they like about the book?
- What would they change in the story?



VISIT THE LIBRARY

The library is an excellent resource for families. Programs, events, materials are available for all readers, at all levels.

Check out the many books, magazines, formats, and genres there are to explore!

ENCOURAGE RE-READING

Practice and repetition are key!

Re-read favorite books. This will provide practice and help to make connections between the reader and the book.



BE FLEXIBLE

Family members may have different interests when it comes to what they want to read. Ask questions and learn from one another!

Act out a story! Read it in a different voice. Find a different place to read (outside, for example). Make it fun and new!
